## Gearing up for SB 1

For the first time, the State of California has created a sustainable state training fund for multi-craft preapprenticeship programs with the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (SB 1). While the bulk of funds raised by SB 1 go towards road maintenance and public infrastructure projects, \$5 million a year is devoted towards preparing California workers for the jobs related to the maintenance and infrastructure activity. #### Clean Slate Program

FRWDB recently expanded its "Clean Slate" program run in partnership with the County of Fresno Public Defender's Office. Unemployed and underemployed clients with legal issues impeding their job search are given access to qualified legal counsel to clear up such problems. Three main focus areas are - amortization of child support payments that are in arrears, expungement of non-serious crimes from a person's record, and clearing of legal holds on driver's license renewals (in

#### COMMUNITY PULSE - CRITICAL EMPLOYMENT TRENDS Latest Data Ending January 31, 2019



The unemployment rate in Fresno County was 8.9 percent in January 2019, up from a revised 7.4 percent in December 2018 and above the year-ago estimate of 8.7 percent.

This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 4.8 percent for California and 4.4 percent for the nation during the same period.

NOTE: Labor Force and Industry data contained in this release differ from previous information due to the U. S. Department of Labor's annual revision process.



#### Between December 2018 and January 2019:

- Total industry employment decreased by 1,300 jobs (down 0.3 percent) to total 390,000
- Non-farm employment rose by 1,600 jobs (down 0.5 percent)
- While farm employment declined by 300 jobs (up 0.8 percent)
- Government posted the largest month-over gain with the addition of 900 jobs
- Gains in federal government (up 1,000 jobs), and state government (up 200 jobs) offset a decline of 300 jobs in local government

Immediately after training, Robert began and completed 180 hours of Transitional Job training on December 21, 2018 as a Construction Laborer with MAG Engineering. Robert's supervisor said that he did a great job during his time at MAG Engineering and he would be happy to offer him a full-time permanent position once it became available.

Robert didn't let that deter his progress. He successfully secured a full-time permanent position as a Construction Laborer with Ararat Armenian Cemetery in Fresno, earning an hourly wage of \$14 per hour.

Robert has been an exemplary participant during his time in the Workforce Connection program and an example to his fellow Pre-Apprentices.
