\$1.6M Grant Awarded to Workforce Development Board For Careers in Forestry Training Program

FRESNO, CA – The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection has awarded the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) \$1,675,200 to implement a no-cost training program for careers in forestry.

Blake Konzcal, Executive Director of the FRWDB stated, "This grant gives our organization the opportunity to work hand-in-hand with our partners to provide a quality no-cost training program that will prepare the workforce of Fresno County for long-term rewarding careers in the forestry industry."

The FRWDB, through a collaborative partnership with Reedley College and Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission/Local Conservation Corps will conduct a five-month training program that will prepare participants for entry-level positions within the forestry industry. The first training co-hort is expected to begin in late-February 2020 and will be held in Fresno and Reedley.
